

Casting the Ancient Anew

As I write this, it is currently 112° outside my hotel room. I'm at Bishop's Convocation, which is a gathering of clergy from our Annual Conference that takes place every two years. This year the focus of our gathering has been around a subject that has been near and dear to my heart and my calling for ministry for a number of years—transformation. Bishop Hagiya shared with us a teaching that I have been using for about 5 years now called "Theory U". At the upper left of the "U" is where we start and it's called Suspend.

We Start Here



The first step of achieving closer relationship with God is to suspend our thinking. Bishop Hagiya described it as unlearning what we have learned. It is the depth of the old church paradigm. And that can be a really scary place to be, but it is also what we must do if we are going to grow deeper in our relationship with Jesus. If we are going to grow deeper in our relationship with Jesus, we will have to let go of our cynicism and our anxiety over the current state of the

church both our dear Good Shepherd and the Christian church as a whole. As I shared earlier, I have been using foundational theory behind the small group process known as Huddle. I am currently in a small group with other clergies from our Annual Conference and I continue to encourage all of us to gather in small groups for our own Spiritual growth. This isn't Bible study, although you can certainly study the Bible together. Instead, Huddle offers each of us the opportunity to recognize our thinking and our actions, and then to "suspend" those actions we observe the situation with new eyes. One of our District Superintendents—Jan Wiley preached about learning to stand in a place in order to see the situation with new eyes. Once we get through the process of "Suspending" we are able to observe our lives from this new vantage point and open ourselves to sensing where God might be in a new and/or different way. Once through these three steps, we are at total emptiness; we are free from all of our preconceived ideas, all of our cynicism and fears. This is communion with God.
