Pastor's Devotion

Feeling Content and Enough

"I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus." Philippians 3:14

Sodom, the capital of the kingdom ruled by King Bera, was such a great and beautiful city that it was often likened to "the garden of the Lord" and the "land of Egypt".

Sodom, together with Gomorah, Admah, Zeboiim, and Zoar, was one of the five cities of the plain of the Jordan. The Plain also covered the Dead Sea and its vicinity. Except for the city of Zoar, the four other cities were all destroyed.

According to the Bible: "Then the Lord rained on Sodom and Gomorrah sulfur and fire from the Lord out of heaven; and he overthrew those cities, and all the Plain, and all the inhabitants of the cities, and what grew on the ground." Genesis 19:24-25

Tourists who visit this area today can still see the ruins of those cities. I myself got to see the ruins during my trip in 2010.

From the Bible, we can understand why God decided to destroy the cities. It was impossible to find even 10 righteous inhabitants in each of them: "Now the people of Sodom were wicked, great sinners against the Lord." Genesis 13:13

The Lord said: "How great is the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah and how very grave their sin!"
Genesis 18:20

Lot and his family had settled in the plain of the Jordan: "Lot looked about him, and saw that the plain of the Jordan was well watered everywhere like the garden of the Lord, like the land of Egypt, in the direction of Zoar; this was before the Lord had destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah. So Lot chose for himself all the plain of the Jordan, and Lot journeyed eastward; thus they separated from each other." Genesis 13:10-11

The story of Sodom and Gomorrah is a lesson about making a timely decision to repent and turn back to God for full salvation through obedience, albeit "only as through fire."

In the day of destruction, Lot and his family was ordered to "flee" and "not look back":

"When they had brought them outside, they said, "Flee for your life; do not look back or stop anywhere in the Plain; flee to the hills, or else you will be consumed." Genesis 19:17

* How we follow God's orders in days of judgment may be similar to how Lot and his family followed His orders back then.

Lot and his two daughters ran without looking back and came to Zoar although they were supposed to head for the hills. But Lot's wife, behind him, looked back, and she became a pillar of salt.

Lot and his two daughters had intended to stay in Zoar. However, when they saw that Sodom had been destroyed, they went up out of Zoar and ran towards the hills for they were afraid to stay in Zoar.

The sun was already setting and it was impossible for Lot and his daughters to reach the hills. So they stayed in a cave and there they committed sins against the Lord.

THE LESSON: FEELING CONTENT AND ENOUGH (verse 18)

Lot said to the Lord's angels: "Oh, no, my lords; your servant has found favor with you, and you have shown me great kindness in saving my life; but I cannot flee to the hills, for fear the disaster will overtake me and I die." Genesis 19:18-19

Lot felt content and enough after he managed to escape from the city. He told the Lord's angels that he "has found favor with" the Lord and the Lord has shown him "great kindness" in saving his life. However, what kind of favor has Lot found with the Lord?

It was true that the Lord has saved Lot from destruction. However, was God's mercy to such an extent only?

* Is God's love meant to save human beings' lives only? Is His "great kindness" restricted to saving Lot from destruction only? Is that it?

Truly it is not like that! Such a degree of kindness is only a small part of God's immeasurable love for us. When we become content with God's kindness, we are easily prone to not see more of how kind and merciful God can be.

God's order for Lot was: "Flee to the hills!" Unless he obeyed and went to the hills, Lot would not be able to discern God's full grace and mercy.

Many of us may grow so content with God's grace, which has saved us from destruction, that we may overlook a more beautiful reality God has intended for us in the afterlife, which is we shall inherit His kingdom and His crown, co-reign with Him, and sit next to Him.

Many of us, just like Lot, feel content and enough and thus have no intention of further seeking God and His kingdom.

Indeed our days are fleeting. Nonetheless, how many of us are genuinely serious about the idea that we should invest more time in building up our spiritual fortune?

We must run and run faster, otherwise we may not reach the mountain top in time, given rough obstacles along the way. Therefore, the Bible keeps on reminding us to run and run as we journey with God.

The reality of our world is that people nowadays ceaselessly attempt to run faster and faster as they seek advancements in their careers, studies and other physical aspects of their lives. Aren't we supposed to run too as we journey with God?

But the land that you are crossing over to occupy is a land of hills and valleys, watered by rain from the sky, a land that the Lord your God looks after. The eyes of the Lord your God are always on it, from the beginning of the year to the end of the year.
